WHAT IS ACADEMIC WRITING?

Academic writing is a **collection of expectations** determining how one can **effectively write** in the academic setting. These expectations come from an **academic audience** (such as instructors and academic peers).

ONE CAN WRITE EFFECTIVELY BY...

- **Being specific** when conveying one's ideas
- **Explaining** one's ideas **clearly**
- **Being concise** when explaining one's ideas
- **Utilizing evidence** to support one's ideas
- **Incorporating Ideas and concepts** from relevant academic fields in one's writing
- **Remaining focused** by **connecting** one's **ideas** to a **main point**
- **Analyzing** a subject with an **unbiased mindset**
- **Being respectful** when discussing other's ideas
- Be **aware** of how your **audience** may interpret your writing
